

## Breaking down barriers to live independently with a rare disease

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
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# Persons with disabilities include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others

UNCRPD Art. 1








## The majority of people with rare diseases live with disabilities.



#### What are we advocating for?

#### All people living with rare diseases and disability must access:

- Adequate disability assessment and recognition\*
- Adequate social protection and independent living support

European Strategy for Persons with Disabilities provides some advocacy opportunities. EURORDIS is also a member of the EU Disability Platform.



Approach by special rights for people with rare diseases or by rights for people with a single disease is rarely the solution!

### The power of words!

Fighting for healthcare, social, human rights.

People, person (patient, if healthcare related)

Rare disease a dvocates, people with lived experience (not always patient advocates)

Family member (who are often the main carers)

Holistic care and full participation in society

Disability (vs functionality, impairment)

What the person wants, what the family wants, what others think they want
